Keizer Rapids Turf Field Groundbreaking

Officials from the state, Marion Co. and City of Keizer as well as citizens and representatives of city organizations gathered on March 21 for the official groundbreaking for the multi-sport turf field project at Keizer Rapids Park. West Keizer Neighborhood Association President Rhonda Rich and WKNA Board member Art Mauer joined Oregon Rep. Kevin Mannix, Marion Co. Commissioner Colm Willis, Keizer Mayor Cathy Clark, City Councilors Shaney Starr, Laura Reid, Robert Husseman, Kyle Juran, Soraida Cross and Dan Kohler for the event. Representatives from Keizer

Chamber of Commerce attended, as well as McNary High School Principal Scott Gragg. Mayor Clark recognized WKNA in her remarks for supporting the project from the beginning.

Completion is expected by this summer on the two multi-sport fields, fencing and graveled parking lot. Fundraising is ongoing to complete other amenities, such as a bathroom, equipment building and bicycle and pedestrian improvements.
